# **Child Care Services**

- □ Child Care Resource and Referral -Helps parents locate child care and gives information on what to look for when choosing child care (1-800-462-8261) or [http://www.state.tn.us/humanserv/ childcare/providers-map.htm].
- □ Child Support Division collects courtordered child support payments from absent parents [http://www.state.tn. us/humanserv/child\_support.htm].

## **Health Department Services**

- □ Well Child Exams Well child exams are available for children from birth to age 21 who do not have a primary health provider.
- Genetics and Newborn Screening -Provides families who have or are at risk for genetic disorders with screening, testing to diagnose genetic diseases, and counseling services.
- □ **Family Planning Program** Provides medical exams/evaluations, laboratory tests, education, counseling, and contraceptive (birth control) supplies.
- WIC (Women, Infants, and Children) Program - Provides nutrition education, health care referral and support, and supplemental nutritious food for women, infants and children who meet program guidelines.
- Parents Encouraging Parents (PEP) Program - Matches parents of children with disabilities or chronic illness with parents whose children have just been diagnosed with special needs. The program offers reliable, current information and help in locating resources and services.

- □ Help Us Grow (HUG) Project Arranges services for pregnant women and mothers up to two years after giving birth and for their infants and children up to 6 years of age. The coordinator will help participants get needed health, social, educational, and other services.
- ☐ The Healthy Start Program Home visiting program for first-time parents through the child's fifth birthday, available in 29 counties. Families receive a high level of support, parent education, and child development testing. Families are referred to agencies that can help with needs that are found.
- The Tennessee Resource Mothers Program - Available in Chester, Lauderdale, Henderson, Fayette, Decatur, and Hardeman Counties only. Volunteer home visitors provide social support and health education for the teenager and her family.
- Children's Special Services for Children With Disabilities - Provides health care including speech and hearing services for children with disabilities from birth to 21 years of age for persons who meet program income and medical standards.
- Children's Special Services Care Coordination - Coordinators help families to get the needed medical, social, educational, and other services for their child with disabilities and help them to get access to TennCare or other insurance.



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**Families First Programs** (to be eligible, teen parents under 18 years of age must stay in school and live at home with their parents or another responsible adult.)

- □ Child Care Assistance Helps pay for child care while a parent is enrolled in the program and for 18 months after leaving the program.
- □ **Transportation Assistance** Provides help with car repairs, vouchers for public transportation, no-interest car loans, or van routes. All except car repair are available for a limited time after leaving the program.
- □ Family Services Counseling Provides counseling for learning disabilities, alcohol or drug abuse, domestic violence, problems with children's behavior, or mental health problems. Available for one year after leaving the program.
- Medicaid/TennCare provides medical insurance throughout the program and for 18 months after leaving the program (TennCare Information Line 1-800-669-1851).
- □ EPSDT or Tennessee Caring for Kids offers free well-child checkups for children up to age 21.
- □ **Employment Career Specialists (ECS)** work with clients to find out what skills they have and to help them find and keep a job and grow in their careers.
